

The Mining Industry in Virginia - Ninth District, 2007

Represented in Congress by Rick Boucher (D), Virginia's Ninth District is home to 226 mining operations and provided direct employment to 10,229 mine operators and contractors in the district.

Mining industry jobs in Virginia's Ninth District are high paying. The average mining industry wage in Virginia was \$55,527 in 2007 compared to an average wage of \$45,995 for the state. The mining industry generated a payroll of \$608.7 million in the Virginia's Ninth district. Personal income and payroll taxes from mining and related industry payrolls in the Ninth District totaled \$358.2 million.

American mining generates the critical raw materials necessary for the foundation of our economy. From the minerals and materials used in housing, automobiles, and computers, to the mined coal and uranium that generates more than half of our nation's electricity.

In Virginia's Ninth District, the mining community supports 18,168 jobs.
